The Enigmatic Mr. Green – a talk by Jean Riddell

Hear how this remarkable man who appeared in Hertford in the 1740's seemingly exerted an extraordinary influence over one family in particular, and ultimately, upon the town's musical life. Jean is a well known local historian who has been involved with Hertford Museum for many years including as a Friend and volunteer.

Cromer Windmill – a talk by Andrew Rixon

FOHM member Andrew has, for several years, helped at Cromer Windmill in the Parish of Ardeley, where he regularly shows visitors round and explains the workings of the mill. From 2022 he has taken many of the duties of custodian from Robin Webb of Buntingford, thus increasing his involvement with the windmill, which is Hertfordshire's only surviving post mill, the earliest type of windmill.
